FEAST DAYS

Tuesday 27th June St. Cyril of Alexandria

(370 - 444) St Cyril was the Patriarch of Alexandria in Egypt. He was the most acute and profound theologian. As bishop and doctor, he became the glory of the Church in Egypt. During the Council of Ephesus, he defended the oneness of the person in Jesus Christ and the divine maternity of the Blessed Virgin Mary against the heresy of Nestorius.

Wednesday 28th June St. Irenaeus

(130 - 202) He was a disciple of St Polycarp of Smyrna. At a time when Gnostic sects threatened to undermine Christianity by a perversion of Christian thought, St Irenaeus vigorously denounced all heresies and safeguarded unity of belief. He succeeded the martyred St Pothinus in the See of Lyons

Thursday 29th June Solemnity of Ss Peter and Paul, Apostles. (Holyday of Obligation)

St. Peter died C. 64. Leader of the Apostles, a fisherman from Bethsaida, witness of the Transfiguration and the Agony in the Garden. Called Cephas by Christ as the 'rock', the preminent leader of the early Church. Very early tradition linked him to the Church in Rome as its first Bishop and being martyred under the persecution of Nero.

St. Paul died c.65. Apostle of the Gentiles. A Jew bom in Tarsus who dramatically changed from being a persecutor to the great missionary of Christianity. Through his letters he did much to further Christian theology. According to tradition he was beheaded as a Roman citizen during the persecution of Nero.

Friday 30th June First Martyrs of the Holy Roman Church

The Church celebrates this feast in memory of the martyrs of the persecution under Nero at about 64AD. Many Christians were killed with atrocious torments. They were people of all professions and levels of society.

Saturday 1st July St Oliver Plunket

(1629 - 1681) St Oliver Plunkett was ordained a priest in 1654 after studying at the Irish College, Rome. He stayed on in Rome as a professor and a representative of the Irish bishops. In 1669 he was appointed Archbishop of Armagh and Primate of all Ireland. He did much to reorganise and strengthen the Irish church, despite being forced into hiding for much of his episcopate. He was arrested in 1679 at the time of the Popish Plot, he was hanged, drawn and quartered in London on I July 1681 the last Catholic martyr to suffer in England.
