(1580 - 1654) St Peter Claver was born at Verdu in Catalonia, Spain, and entered the Society of Jesus. In 1610 he was sent to Columbia and began his life's work among the slaves. He cared for them and baptised more than 300,000 during his thirty three years of tireless ministry.

Egwin was an early eighth-century Bishop of Worcester. Little is known of his life but he seems likely to have founded the Abbey at Evesham. This abbey was founded on the site of the first known appearance of Our Lady in England. The foundation of the abbey at Evesham is attributed to an Eighth Century Bishop of Worcester called Egwin.
