FEAST DAYS

Monday 22nd October St John Paul II, Pope

Charles Joseph Wotjtyta was born in 1920 in Wadowice, Poland. After his ordination to the priesthood and theological studies in Rome, he returned to his homeland and resumed various pastoral and academic tasks. He became first auxiliary bishop and, in 1964, Archbishop of Krakow and took part in the Second Vatican Council. On 16 October 1978 he was elected pope and took the name John Paul II. His exceptional apostolic zeal, particularly for families, young people and the sick, led him to numerous pastoral visits throughout the world. Among the many fruits which he has left as a heritage to the Church are above all his rich Magisterium and the promulgation of the Catechism of the Catholic Church as well as the Code of Canon Law for the Latin Church and for the Eastern Churches. In Rome on 2 April 2005, the eve of the Second Sunday of Easter (or of Divine Mercy), he departed peacefully in the Lord.

Tuesday 23rd October St John of Capistrano

John was born at Capistrano in the year 1386. For a short time he held the office of judge. As a member of the Friars Minor, he was ordained priest and travelled across Europe preaching the Gospel. He died in Austria in the year 1456.

Wednesday 24th October St Antony Claret

(1807 - 1870) St Antony Mary Claret was born at Salient, Spain, in the year 1807. As a priest he is remembered for his missionary work in Catalonia and the Canary Islands, and founding the Claretian Fathers. He was ordained Bishop of Cuba. He spread devotion to the Blessed Sacrament and the Immaculate Heart of Mary. He died in 1870.

Friday 26th October St Cedd

St Cedd, like Chad, was educated at Lindisfame and was bishop to the East Saxons at Bradwell, with his See at Othona. He died in the year 664.

- ❖ **PLEASE SAY A PRAYER** for some of the women at Drake Hall Prison, who are due to be received into the Church at Mass this Friday. We pray especially that they will persevere in the choice they have made when they have finished their time in prison.
- ❖ **HOLYDAY OF OBLIGATION:** Please note that Thursday November 1st is the Solemnity of All Saints and is a Holyday of Obligation, when we are bound to attend Mass. The Vigil Mass of the Feast will be on Wednesday October 31st at 7.30pm, and on the day itself there will be Mass at 9.30am and 7pm (in Latin).
- ❖ **ALL SOULS DAY:** Friday November 2nd is All Souls Day, when we pray especially for all our beloved dead. A priest can say three Masses that day, so there will be Mass at 9.30am and 6pm (Latin) in church, and at 2.30pm in the prison..
- ❖ **HOLY SOULS ENVELOPES** are available. Please place inside the names of those you wish to be remembered during the month of November, and also any offering you wish to give for a Mass to be said. The envelopes will remain on the altar for the whole of November. It is so important that we remember in our prayers those who have died, that they may speedily see God face to face in the glory of Heaven..
